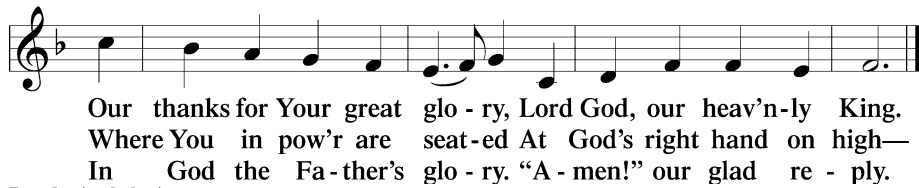

2 Peter 1:16–21

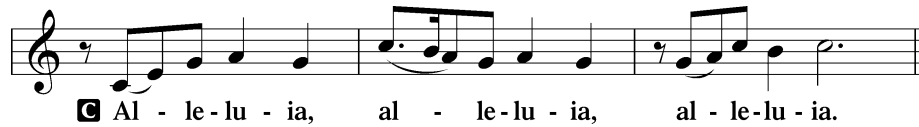
